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GEO Nova Scotia Celebrates Nova Scotia as First Province to Proclaim Digital Inclusion Week

Halifax, NS – [October 7, 2025] – GEO Nova Scotia is thrilled that the Province of Nova Scotia is proclaiming **October 6th to 10th, 2025 as Digital Inclusion Week**, recognizing the critical importance of equitable access to technology, internet connectivity, and digital skills for all Nova Scotians.

Nova Scotia will be the first province to make such a designation, representing a significant step forward in ensuring that no one is left behind in our increasingly digital world. For <u>GEO Nova Scotia</u> and our hundreds of cross-sector partners, the proclamation is a proud achievement and a testament to Nova Scotia's leadership on digital inclusion.

While many essential services are now delivered online—from health care to banking to education—an estimated 20,000 Nova Scotians still lack internet access at home due to cost, with many more unable to afford a suitable device or develop basic digital skills. Digital Inclusion Week underscores the province's commitment to addressing these barriers so all Nova Scotians can thrive.

To mark Digital Inclusion Week, GEO Nova Scotia is hosting <u>GEO Forum 2025</u> on October 8, 2025 in Halifax. This free, one-day hybrid event brings together leaders from government, business, and community for panels, workshops, and discussions highlighting best practices, innovative programs, and collaborative solutions to advance digital equity.

GEO Nova Scotia is also hosting the 2nd Annual <u>Nova Scotia Digital Inclusion Awards</u> on October 8, celebrating digital equity champions in the private, public, and community sectors.

Minister for Cyber Security and Digital Solutions, Jill Balser, is expected to make the proclamation during this afternoon's legislative session.
