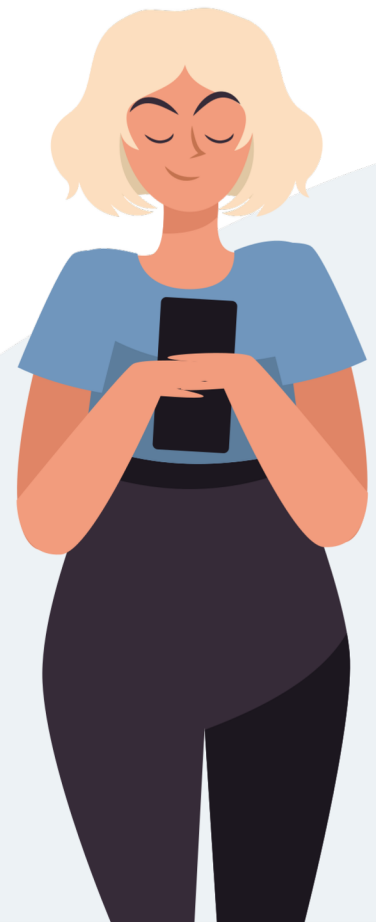

How to Scan a QR Code

1. Open the CAMERA app on your smartphone
